Corporate criminal responsibility – What is at stake when a corporate entity is accused of criminal activity

Although misconduct of a corporation is heavily addressed by civil and administrative laws, today most jurisdictions also recognise circumstances under which corporations (or other non-physical 'persons') can be found guilty of crimes. The relevant laws, procedures and principles are often surprisingly misunderstood; they also vary from country to country, and are evolving in some countries. The issue can be complex for companies and the lawyers who advise them, particularly in the context of trans-border investigations. Legal professional privilege in an uncertain world: protecting confidential communications and work product in multijurisdictional investigations

Growing cooperation between law enforcement authorities and regulators in cross-border investigations is placing the confidentiality of lawyer-client communications at increasing risk. The protections given to these communications and to the work product of lawyers varies by jurisdiction. Efforts to shield confidential communications and materials through the use of joint defence and information sharing agreements have met with mixed results. This diverse panel of knowledgeable and accomplished international criminal lawyers will discuss recent enforcement efforts influencing the sanctity of professional privilege and the work product doctrine, and consider possible countermeasures.
